It involves twenty partners from Africa and Europe that represent different research areas (nutritional and food sciences, crop science, agricultural and food economics) and stakeholders (companies, extension experts, political lobbyists). The project manager will be based at Justus-Liebig University Giessen and support the Scientific Coordinator. Assisting the Scientific Coordinator and the project partners in the management and administration of the project. The position is at the Chair of Crop Production and Yield Physiology, Institute of Crop Production and Plant Breeding I at the Department of Agricultural Sciences, Ecotrophology and Environmental Management.
